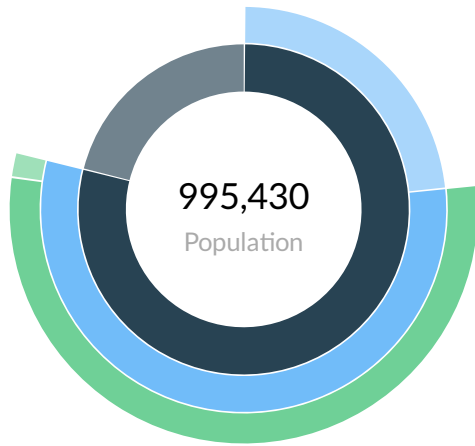

- Concerning educational attainment, **32.2% of Collin County, TX residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (13.6% above the national average), and **7.6% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.4% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2018 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Computer Systems Design and Related Services.

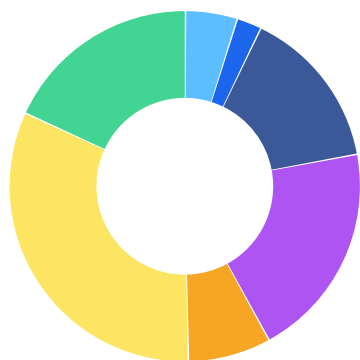

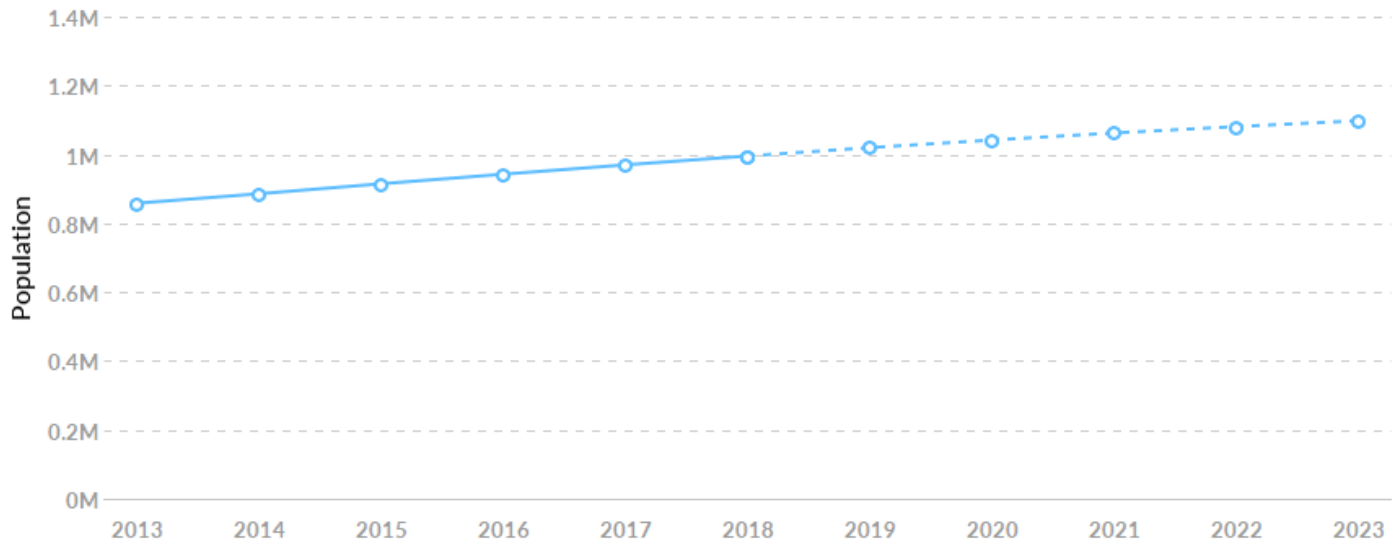

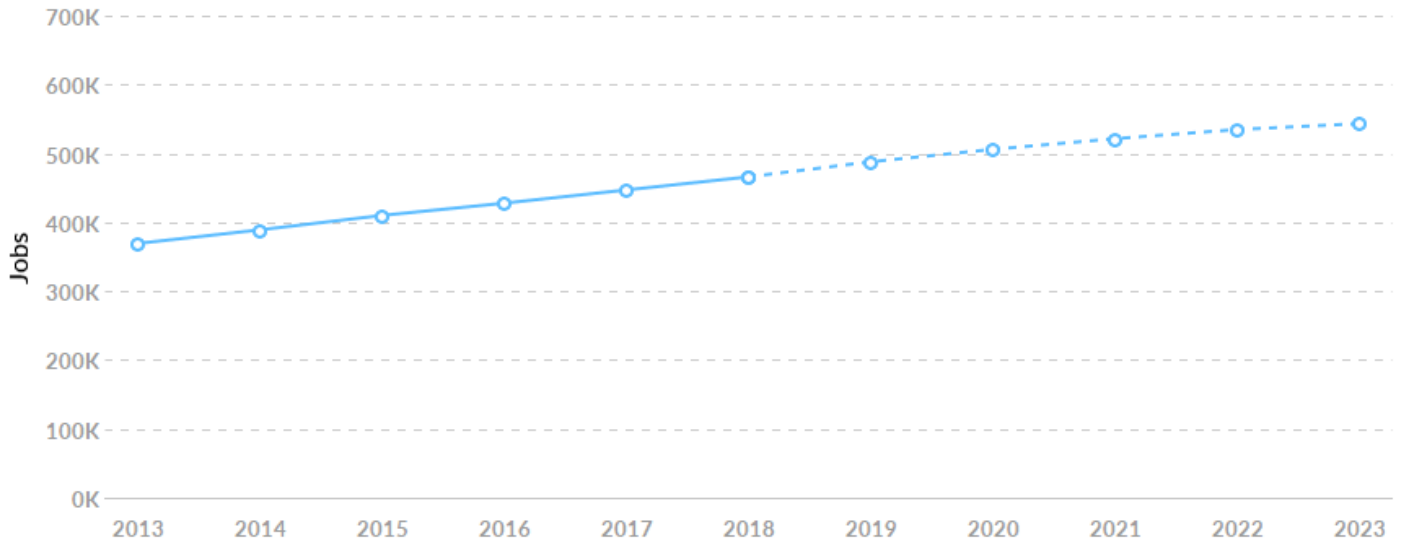

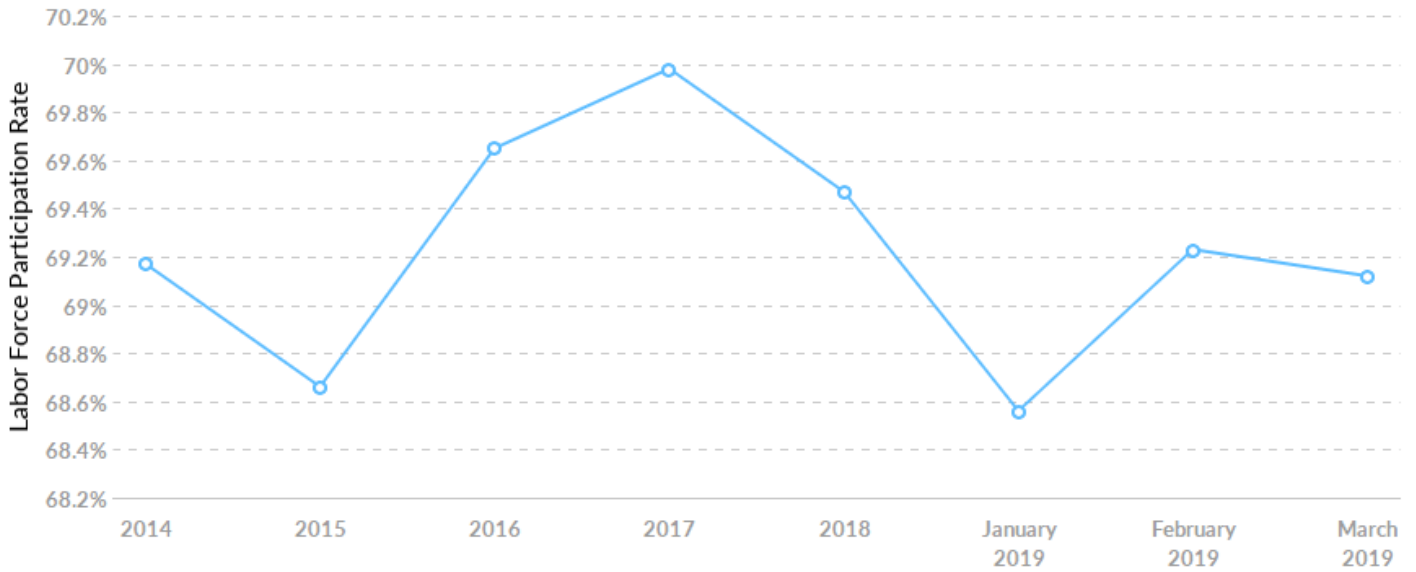
Job Trends

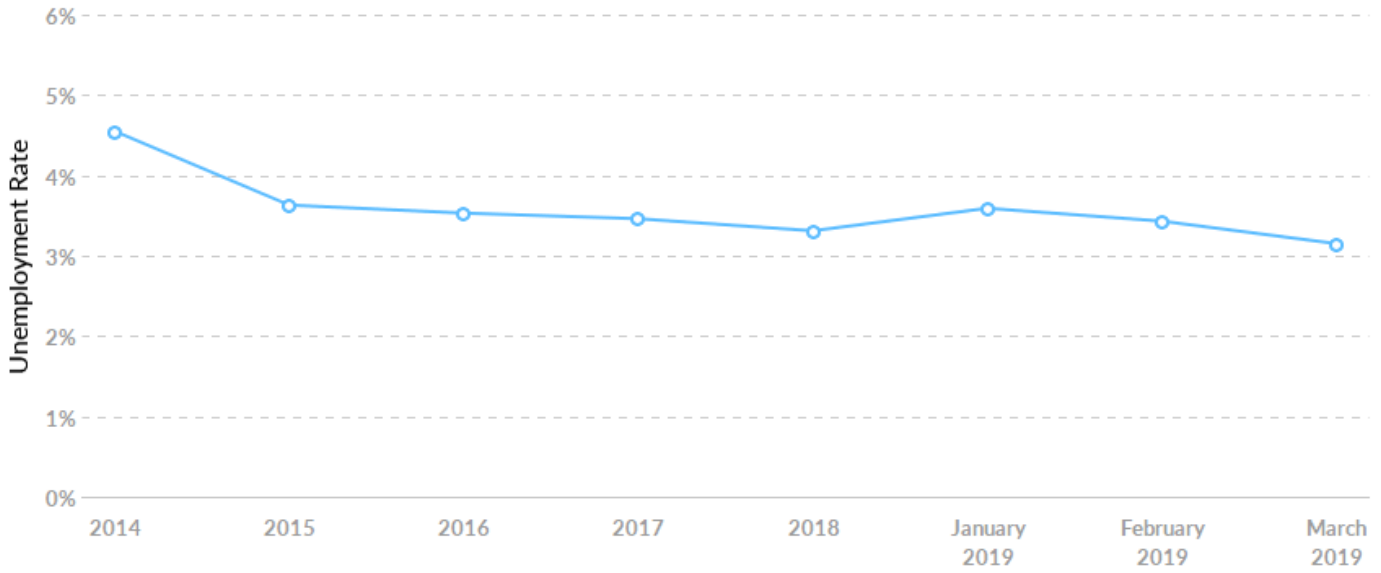

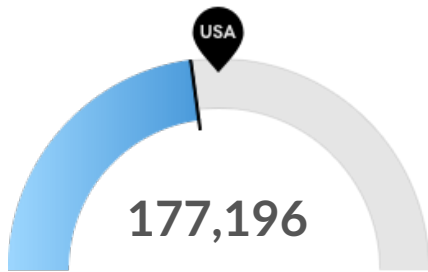
Unemployment Rate Trends

Collin County, TX had a March 2019 unemployment rate of 3.15%, **decreasing from 4.55%** 5 years before.



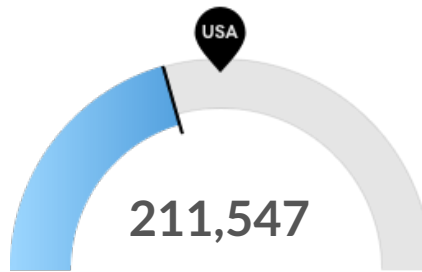

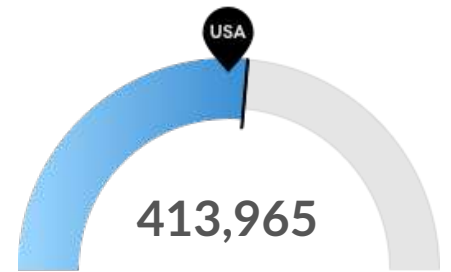
Millennials

Collin County, TX has 177,196 millennials (ages 20-34). The national average for an area this size is 200,819.



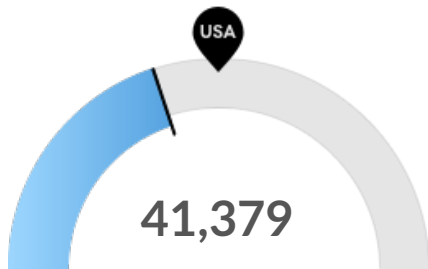
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is low in Collin County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 276,410 people 55 or older, while there are 211,547 here.



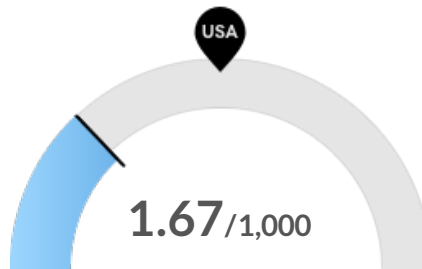
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is about average in Collin County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 380,782 racially diverse people, while there are 413,965 here.



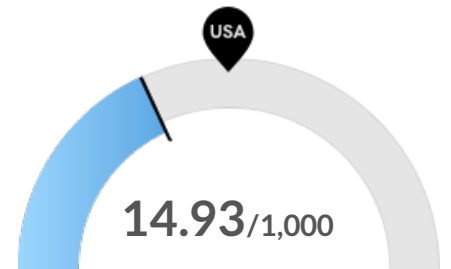
Veterans

Collin County, TX has 1.67 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.86 per 1,000 people.

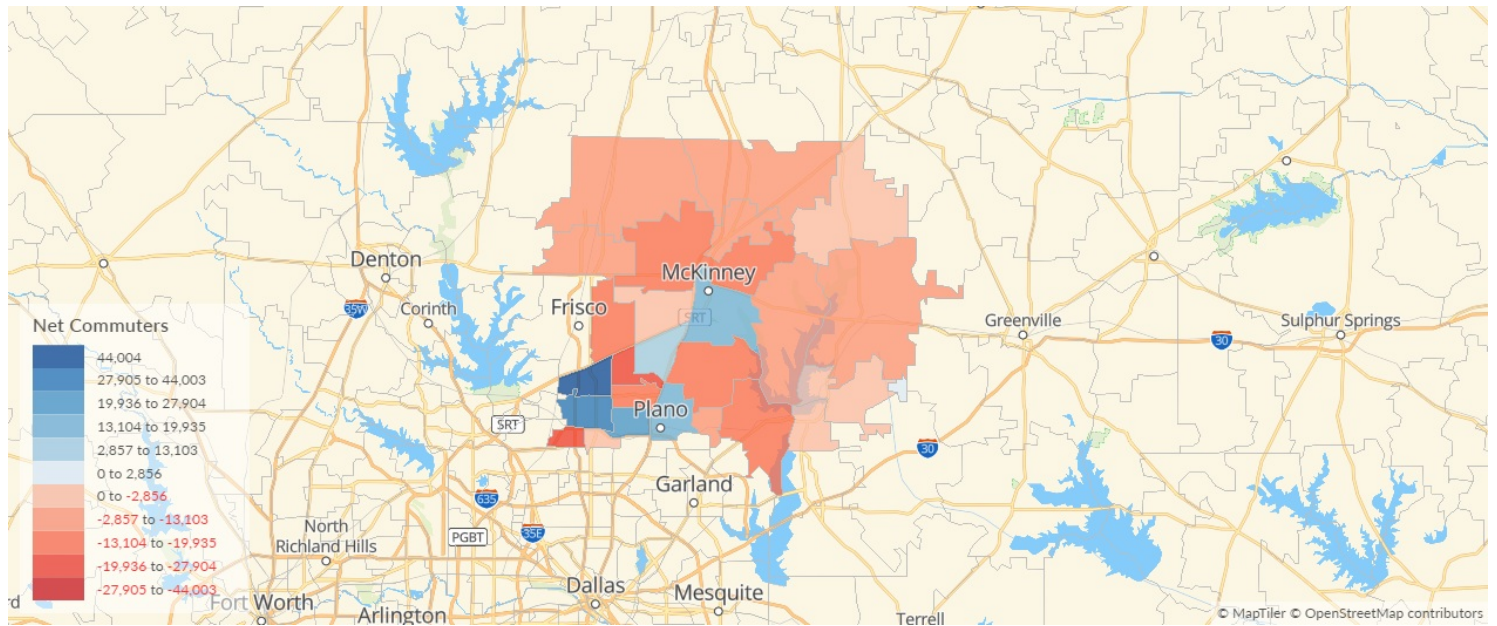


Property Crime

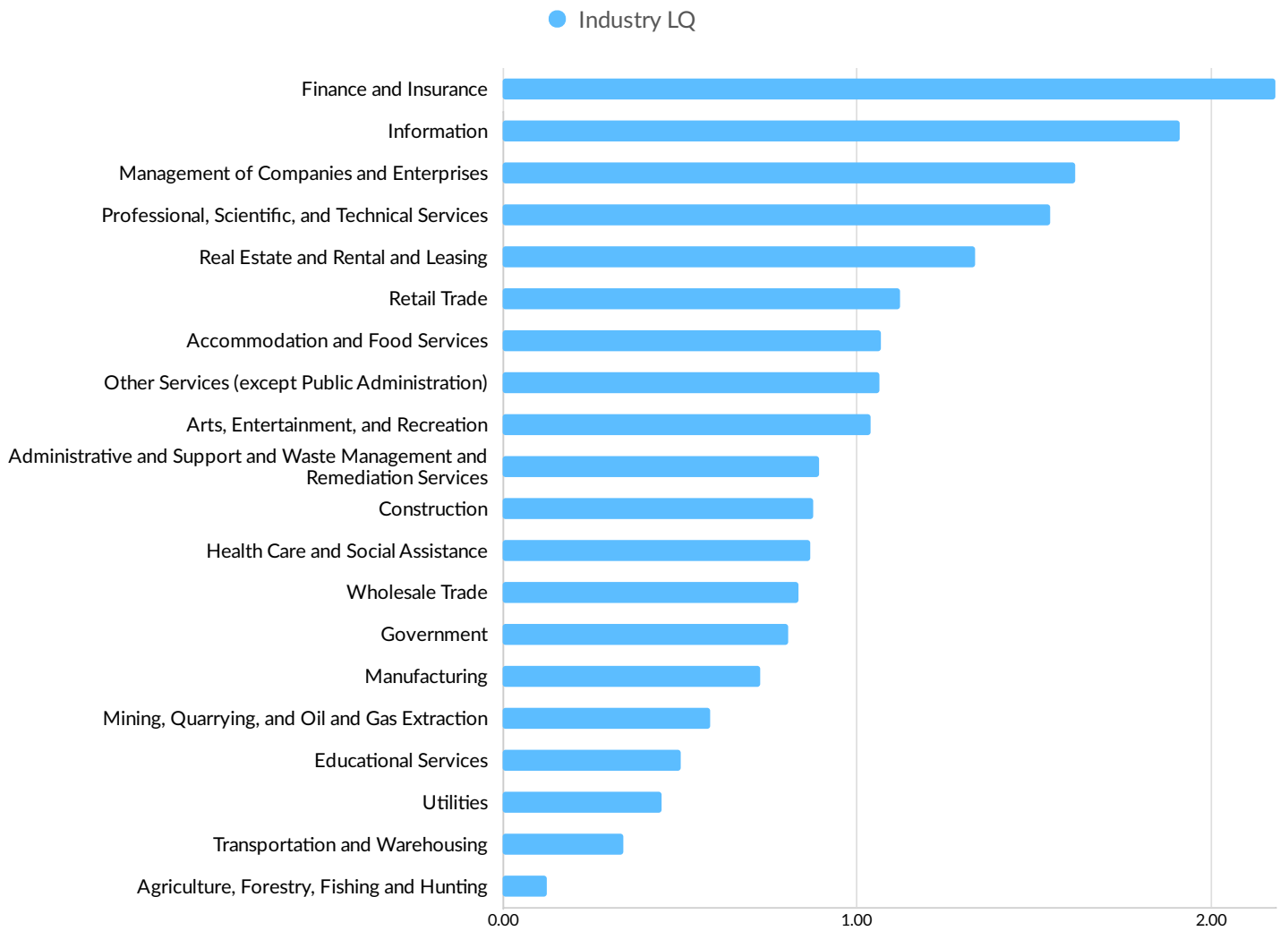

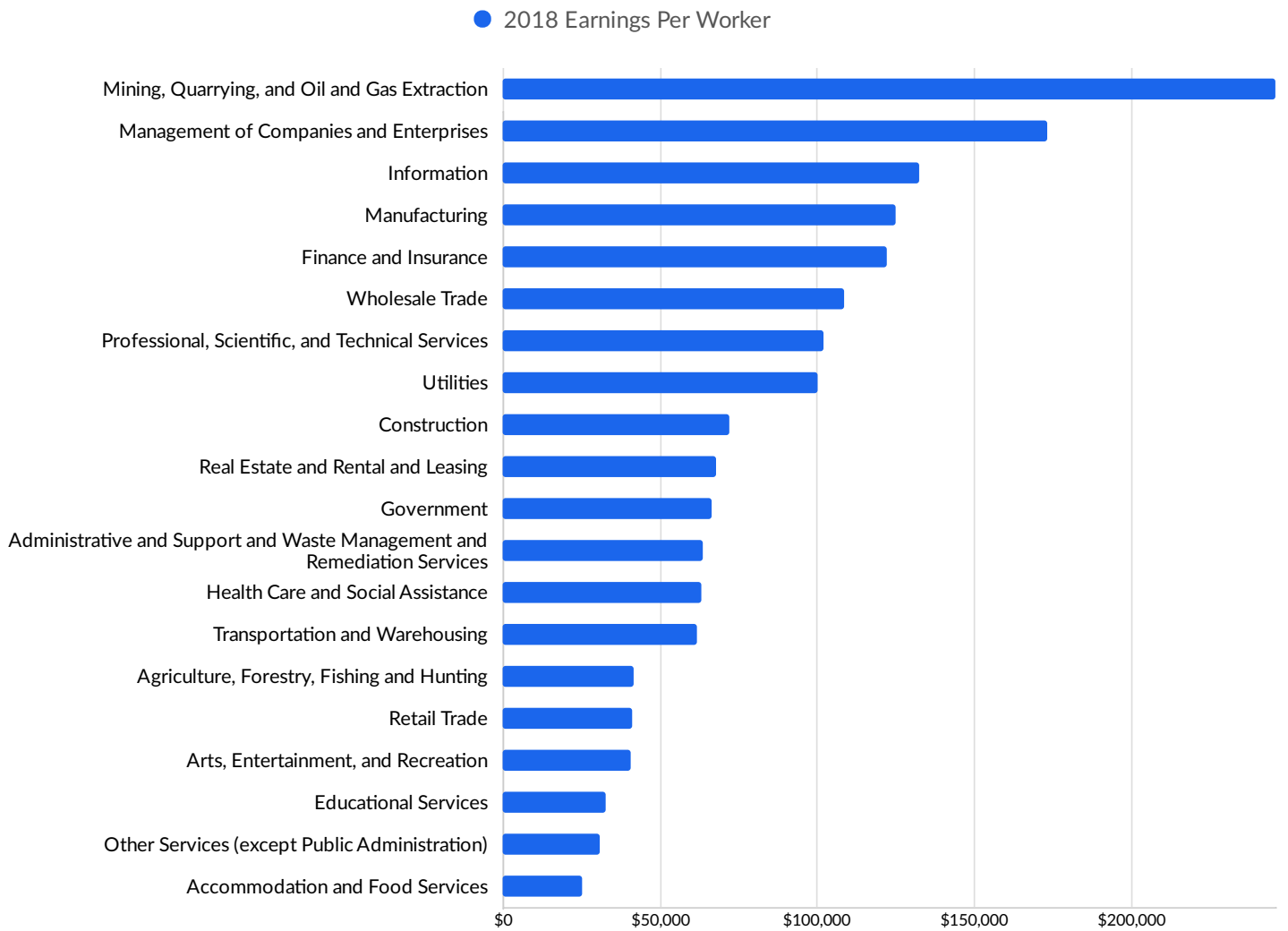

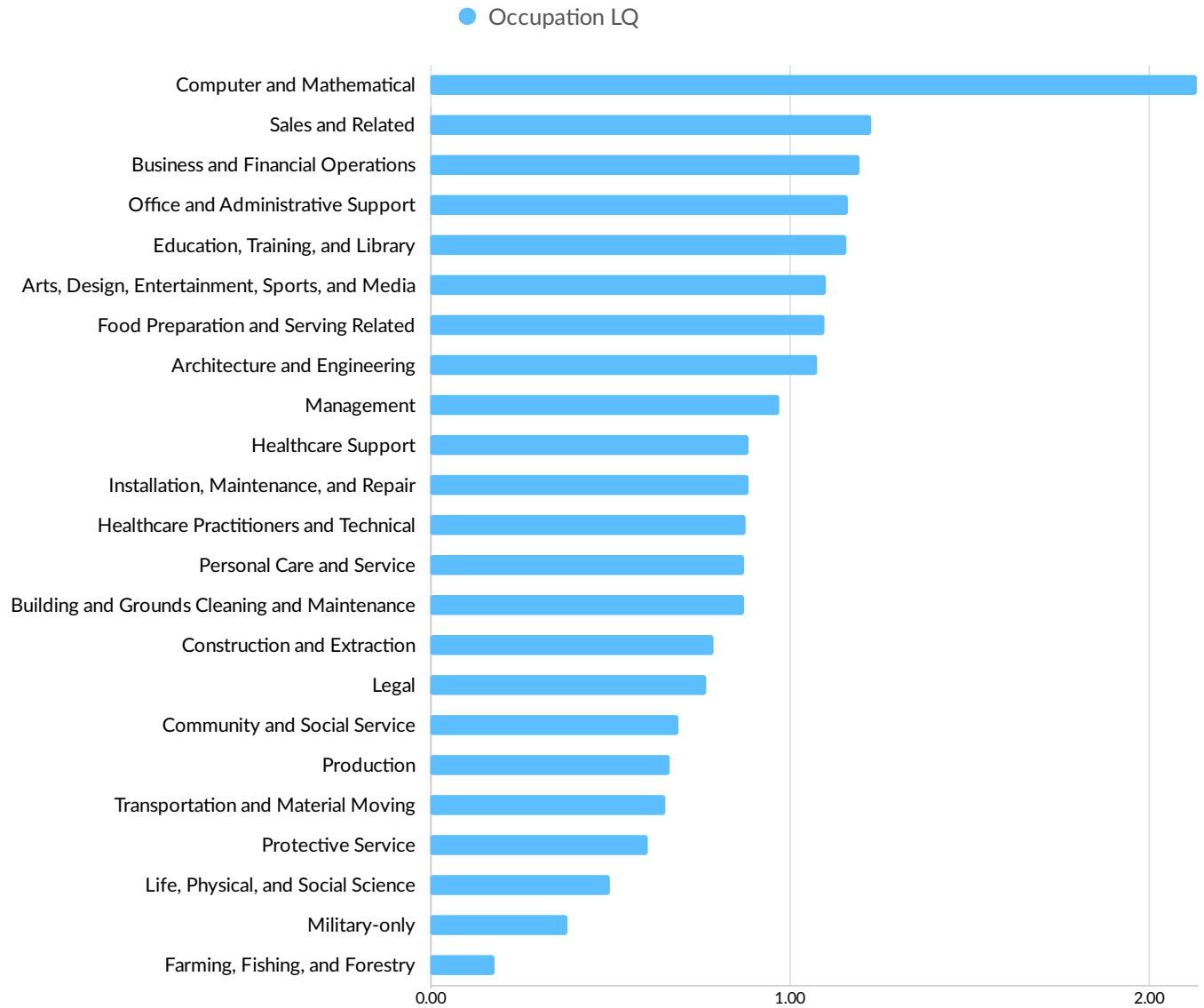
